- Jan 16th - Parent presentation and values activity for feedback on a vision for the learning commons
- Jan. 16th - LCC committee meeting to report back on the Standards Document, discussions on next steps including need for broader community understanding of values and beliefs prior to setting goals
- Dec. 19th - Committee Meeting - Specific roles have been assigned to help create the school vision based on the Leading Learning Document Standards of Practice for School Library Learning Commons in Canada
- Dec. 1, 2018 - committee formed
- Nov. 13th, 2018 - presented initial understanding of the goals of the learning commons and invited staff to join a committee
- October, 2018 - invited student population to spend lunch in the learning commons
- Sept. 2018 - VP/ Library Clerk/Teacher Librarian clarify their roles in the creation of a learning commons
- Sept. 2018 - Identified the need to open the learning commons at lunch, restructured EA schedules to accommodate
- Sept. 2018 - With student input, created expected behaviours for the learning commons

Oct. 24th - combined the Community Engagement committee with the Values committee as the work was common, met and put forward rough plans

Jan. 24th - School wide motivational assembly Safire. Tied in presenter message with our school compass quadrants.

Jan. 15th - students created spinner covers to personalize their desired learning journeys. Student feedback: Children taking us (educators) to task on wanting to go on their personalized learning journey (S).

Jan. 11th - Planning with D.David for the compassion lessons was clearly communicated because of our deep understanding of the values we wanted him to emphasize in the lessons. Our clear vision has allowed him to have focused lessons to support our work, while at the same time supporting the specific needs of the three varied classes.

Jan. 9th/10th - 4 assemblies (fireside chats) to launch the concept of a Q compass, students tasked with creating cover for their compass spinner. Staff feedback: Children able to communicate purpose of compass and their spinner cover to their teachers who were absent during the fire side chats.)

Dec. 19th Doug David committed to do a series of three Compassion/Kindness lessons in January with presentation to the whole school during our Feb. 14th Compassion assembly

Dec. 12th Reached out to District staff for lesson support

Dec. 11th Staff Meeting - Explored our first quadrant of Compassion - defined it, brainstormed class and school activities.

Nov. 30th - Staff survey on launch order (Compassion, Community, Connections and Communication) 80% response rate - shared decision making
