If we do

- Provide staff professional development regarding environments that support student learning such as: de-stimulation of rooms, natural vs artificial lighting, optional seating options, making sensory tools available, scheduling (visual supports)

Work Plan

First we will see

- Changes in the classrooms reflecting the above

So a little later we will see

- Students utilizing the environment to self-regulate and able to rejoin learning opportunities

April 16th - EA session with Andrew Mackenzie - final review and Q/A focusing on impacts on the brain (trauma)

April 9th - Staff meeting - staff reflection on current work and set personal action items for the following month on this goal.

April 1st - EASE training for A. Davidge - topic anxiety, share out at next staff meeting.

March 10th - follow up session offered , invitation to staff to work with Andrew Mackenzie, Pathways to healing - 'Office Hours at the Q - fewer staff requested, 1/2 day scheduled.

March 1 - Budget allocations finalized for tools to assist with sensory needs of students (hoki stools, balance ball seating, heart rate monitors, fidget mazes etc.) - logged in budget (Evergreen)

Feb. 19th - Office Hours at the Q - Andrew Mackenzie, 1 hour slots - 10 teachers and 5 EAs released to work through self regulation issues, potential triggers and sharing of strategies. Positive response that spurred on further collaboration

Feb. 7th - invitation to staff to work with Andrew Mackenzie, Pathways to healing - 'Office Hours at the Q " positive response - EA and teacher

Jan. 24th - Based on conversations that took place on the 22nd, teachers have begun to request tools their colleagues discussed at the staff meeting.

Jan. 22 Review of work done at the staff meeting, table discussions, what is working and what has been tried?, consider ideas for further changes

Dec. Based on feedback , EA Shepherd revamped the Q zone as a calming space as well as the Project Room

Dec. 18th - added Glover to Andrew Mackenzie's case load, established date for next EA session Jan. 29th, brainstormed further ideas for support as well as article with recommendations (to be reviewed in January)

Oct. 30th and Dec. 4th - EA sessions (2 @ 1hr) Inservice with Andrew McKenzie - Pathways to Healing

Nov. 13th Full staff training - Ready Do Done - Andrea Wilson OT

Nov. 21st - PAC session - families supporting the Self Reg work at Queneesh - Andrew McKenzie - Pathways to Healing

November - weekly consults Andrew McKenzie with targeted classrooms (Davidge/Rehnbj/Carmichael) and the Breakfast program

Sept. 28th Continued discussion with School based Curriculum Implementation Day - all teach staff

Aug. 29th Prod - all teaching staff, in-service on Trauma Informed Practice, Pathways to Healing, Andrew MacKenzie.

Aug. 15, 2018 Restructured EA schedules to attend all staff meetings and have collaboration time with teachers
